Ask someone who always gets their work done on time for their top tips on staying on schedule.






Find a good format or approach to studying and try it out with a classmate.





Take a lunch walk with a fellow student and discuss how you both experienced the morning.






Think about what happened today on your way home and note down three things that you learned.






At the start of the next lesson, ask the teacher to give a quick rundown of what has been covered so far.






Can you think about three times when you did really well in your studies and what made you successful then?






During a discussion with fellow students, count how many times you have asked a question.






Set a goal for the next day and, afterwards, reflect on why you did or did not achieve it.






Ask someone to observe you in a lesson or an internship and then talk about what her or she noticed.






Think about your day on the way home and decide on one thing you'll do differently your next school/internship day.






Find a fellow student who thinks differently from you on a subject and ask why he or she thinks that way.


